Beatty Award Nomination Form

1. Name of individual.
2. List the health programs this person has been involved with in Utah.
3. Describe this person's achievements in public health above and beyond the requirements of his/her work assignment.
4. Discuss the individual's service and involvement with UPHA.
5. Describe any community activities or volunteer involvement not mentioned above.
6. List the total years this individual has worked in public health.
7. Provide any other information on why this person deserves a special award (e.g. professional degrees or other credentials, special courses completed and publications).
8. Name of individual or group supporting this nomination and contact information.
9. List 2 or 3 characteristics (personal or professional) that are unique to this individual.
